PERMIT CONDITIONS

This permit authorizes the importation of the listed articles, under the conditions specified below. A copy of this permit (including all conditions) must accompany all shipments authorized under this permit.

1. The samples will be selected from apparently pest-free and disease-free sources, frozen, securely packaged in leak-proof containers, maintained and transported at or below 20 degrees F, and shipped to the United States via commercial air freight, military air transport, or air mail.
2. The samples will be consigned to you at the Brooke Army Medical Center or to the following U.S. Army Veterinary laboratories for various laboratory tests required to insure the safety of U.S. personnel aboard.

3. The material authorized through this permit shall be consigned to the approved facilities listed in #2. For analysis as directed by the chiefs of the respective laboratories, LTC Parker as the US Army Surgeon Generals consultant for Vet. Lab Services shall assume full responsibility for the conditions of importation as authorized through this permit.
4. Upon arrival in the United States, the plant materials will be inspected by a representative of Plant Protection and Quarantine (PPQ) or by a Customs and Border Protection, Agriculture Quarantine Inspector (CBP-AQI) and verified to be at or below 20 degrees F at the time of entry will be returned to the permittee, the mails, or to the carrier for delivery to the permittee. Admissible fresh samples will be inspected and must be found free of plant pests, diseases, and other prohibited articles.
5. At the conclusion of the tests, all residues and unused fruit or vegetable material must be destroyed by incineration or by autoclaving.
6. The facilities where the work is performed with the imported plant materials are subject to inspection by a PPQ representative. The importer is responsible to provide appropriate documentation to the SPHD for the imported material under this permit.
7. You must keep your permit valid for the duration that plant materials are in your possession. If the permit holder leaves the institution where the plant material is kept, all plant material regulated by this permit must be destroyed unless a new individual who assumes responsibility for continued maintenance submits a PPQ Form 588 and obtains a permit prior to the permittee's departure. If any information changes (i.e. telephone number or address), you must notify our office immediately with the changes.
